You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the <u>Environmental Protection Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:

The establishment of stormwater management works for the collection, transmission, treatment, and disposal of stormwater runoff from a Re-Manufacturing Facility and Administration Office via a stormwater management facility providing quality and quantity control, ultimately discharging to a tributary of the West Holland River, consisting of the following:

- two (2) infiltration cells sized to provide groundwater recharge for the clean building roof runoff. These cells provide an active storage layer regulated by a perched catch basin to handle excess runoff during large events.
- an additional (3) third infiltration cell on the west side of the site to capture landscape runoff.
- two storm sewer systems servicing parking lot and exterior operating area comprising of catch basins, maintenance holes, and storm sewers, discharging to a dry pond described below;
- a stormwater management dry pond with an active storage volume of 3,400 cubic meters, complete with a controlled outlet structure comprising of two (2) orifices to attenuate peak post development flows to pre-development levels of 1.45 cu.m/s during the 1:100 year storm event, discharging to a StormFilter (SF0814) treatment unit described below;
- a StormFilter (SF0814) treatment unit (or equivalent equipment) housing proprietary media housed in plastic chambers for removal of hydrocarbons and total suspended solids providing an enhanced level of treatment of the storm runoff, complete with a bypass provision to convey overflow to a headwall discharging to a tributary of the West Holland River located approximately 30m to the north of the Site;

- a storm sewer system servicing the access road comprising of catch basins, maintenance holes, and storm sewers, discharging through an inlet control structure to a StormFilter (SF0820) treatment unit described below:
- a StormFilter (SF0820) treatment unit (or equivalent equipment) housing proprietary media housed in plastic chambers for removal of hydrocarbons and total suspended solids (TSS) providing an enhanced level of treatment of the storm runoff, complete with a bypass provision to convey overflow to a headwall discharging to a tributary of the West Holland River located approximately 30m to the north of the Site,

including erosion/sedimentation control measures during construction and all other controls, and appurtenances essential for the proper operation of the aforementioned sewage works,

all in accordance with the submitted supporting documents in Schedule "A".

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

- 1. "Approval" means this entire document and any schedules attached to it, and the application;
- 2. "Director" means a person appointed by the Minister pursuant to section 5 of the EPA for the purposes of Part II.1 of the EPA;
- 3. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the appropriate local District Office of the Ministry, where the Works are geographically located;
- 4. "EPA" means the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19, as amended;
- 5. "Equivalent Equipment" means a substituted equipment or like-for-like equipment that meets the required quality and performance standards of the approved named equipment
- 6. "Ministry" means the ministry of the government of Ontario responsible for the EPA and OWRA and includes all officials, employees or other persons acting on its behalf;
- 7. "Owner" means Toromont Industries Ltd. and includes its successors and assignees;
- 8. "OWRA" means the Ontario Water Resources Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. 8. O.40, as amended;
- 9. "Works" means the sewage Works described in the Owner's application, and this Approval.

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- (1) The Owner shall ensure that any person authorized to carry out work on or operate any aspect of the Works is notified of this Approval and the terms and conditions herein and shall take all reasonable measures to ensure any such person complies with the same.
- (2) The Owner shall design, construct, operate and maintain the Works in accordance with the conditions of this Approval.
- (3) Where there is a conflict between a provision of any document referred to in this Approval and the conditions of this Approval, the conditions in this Approval shall take precedence.
- (4) The issuance of, and compliance with the Conditions of this Approval does not:
 - (a) relieve any person of any obligation to comply with any provision of any applicable statute, regulation or other legal requirement, including, but not limited to, the obligation to obtain approval from the local conservation authority necessary to construct or operate the Works; or
 - (b) limit in any way the authority of the Ministry to require certain steps be taken to require the Owner to furnish any further information related to compliance with this Approval.

2. EXPIRY OF APPROVAL

(1) This Approval will cease to apply to those parts of the Works which have not been constructed within five (5) years of the date of this Approval.

3. CHANGE OF OWNER

- (1) The Owner shall notify the District Manager and the Director, in writing, of any of the following changes within thirty (30) days of the change occurring:
 - (a) change of address of Owner;
 - (b) change of Owner, including address of new owner;
 - (c) change of partners where the Owner is or at any time becomes a partnership, and a copy of the most recent declaration filed under the <u>Business Names Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, c.B17 shall be included in the notification to the District Manager; and
 - (d) change of name of the corporation where the Owner is or at any time becomes a corporation, and a copy of the most current information filed under the <u>Corporations Information Act</u>, R.S.O. 1990, c. C39 shall be included in the notification to the District Manager.
- (2) In the event of any change in ownership of the Works, other than a change to a successor municipality, the Owner shall notify in writing the succeeding owner of the existence of this Approval, and a copy of such notice shall be forwarded to the District Manager and the

Director.

(3) Notwithstanding any other requirements in this Approval, upon transfer of the ownership or assumption of the Works to a municipality if applicable, any reference to the District Manager shall be replaced with the Water Supervisor.

4. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE.

- (1) The Owner shall inspect the Works at least once a year and, if necessary, clean and maintain the Works to prevent the excessive buildup of sediments, oil/grit and/or vegetation.
- (2) The Owner shall maintain a logbook to record the results of these inspections and any cleaning and maintenance operations undertaken, and shall keep the logbook for inspection by the Ministry. The logbook shall include the following:
 - (a) the name of the Works; and
 - (b) the date and results of each inspection, maintenance and cleaning, including an estimate of the quantity of any materials removed.

5. TEMPORARY EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL

- (1) The Owner shall install and maintain temporary sediment and erosion control measures during construction and conduct inspections once every **two (2) weeks** and after each significant storm event (a significant storm event is defined as a minimum of 25 mm of rain in any 24 hours period). The inspections and maintenance of the temporary sediment and erosion control measures shall continue until they are no longer required and at which time they shall be removed and all disturbed areas reinstated properly.
- (2) The Owner shall maintain records of inspections and maintenance which shall be made available for inspection by the Ministry, upon request. The record shall include the name of the inspector, date of inspection, and the remedial measures. if any, undertaken to maintain the temporary sediment and erosion control measures.

6. RECORD KEEPING

(1) The Owner shall retain for a minimum of five (5) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the operation and maintenance activities required by this Approval.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

1. Condition 1 is imposed to ensure that the Works are built and operated in the manner in which they were described for review and upon which approval was granted. This condition is also included to emphasize the precedence of Conditions in the Approval and the practice that the Approval is based on the most current document, if several conflicting documents are submitted for review.

- 2. Condition 2 is included to ensure that, when the Works are constructed, the Works will meet the standards that apply at the time of construction to ensure the ongoing protection of the environment.
- Condition 3 is included to ensure that the Ministry records are kept accurate and current with respect to approved Works and to ensure that subsequent owners of the Works are made aware of the Approval and continue to operate the Works in compliance with it.
- 4. Condition 4 is included to require that the Works be properly operated and maintained such that the environment is protected.
- 5. Condition 5 is included as installation, regular inspection and maintenance of the temporary sediment and erosion control measures is required to mitigate the impact on the downstream receiving watercourse during construction until they are no longer required.
- 6. Condition 6 is included to require that all records are retained for a sufficient time period to adequately evaluate the long-term operation and maintenance of the Works.

Schedule A

1. Environmental Compliance Approval Application for Industrial Sewage Works submitted by Reeve Whitman, Director of Real Estate and Facilities, Toromont Industries Ltd., dated November 17, 2023 for the stormwater management facilities, including design report and all supporting documentation and information.

In accordance with Section 139 of the Environmental Protection Act, you may by written notice served upon me, the Ontario Land Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the Environmental Bill of Rights, 1993, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, within 15 days after receipt of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the Environmental Protection Act provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- a. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

The Notice should also include:

- 1. The name of the appellant;
- 2. The address of the appellant;
- 3. The environmental compliance approval number;
- 4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
- 5. The name of the Director, and;
- 6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
